
#### Christmas party day

Our Christmas dinner day is on Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup> December. We are treating this as a party day for the children in school and therefore the children can come in non-uniform with any festive clothes or accessories welcome.

#### Pantomime (Oh yes it is!)

We are excited to announce that we have the pantomime Aladdin coming to school for all our children on Thursday  $22^{nd}$  December in the morning (9.30am – 11.00am). This will be free to all, as our wonderful PTA – Friends of Christ the King – are very kindly going to pay for this as a Christmas treat for the children.









#### **Christmas end of term Mass**

This will take place on Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> December at 1.30pm in school. **All are welcome!** Parents will be able to collect their children after this. We are looking forward to finishing our busy term with a time of quiet reflection and prayer, celebrated by the children with their wonderful reading and singing.

## 12 Acts of Kindness

In school, we have been having a real focus on kindness during Advent – preparing our hearts for Jesus' birth at Christmas. This has been taught in class PSHE lessons and has also been linked to being kind in any interactions that are taking place in person or via messages, apps or games that the children may be using. We thank you for your support in helping to model this example to the children, so that they understand that what is said in a message is the same as what is said to somebody's face. Further learning about kindness has led the Y3 children to write letters to our local care-home for the residents and our choir will be singing at the Parish lunch on Friday.

#### **Curriculum focus**

Our curriculum is so jam-packed that the children have been continuing to work extremely hard during their lessons, alongside some of the extra festive activities. This is really important to ensure that their knowledge continues to build and that any gaps in learning are addressed. We have worked hard to strike a balance between a range of Advent and Christmas experiences for the children and the need for their learning to be prioritised and to continue throughout this time. Next term our curriculum golden thread, which drives all our learning, is Sustainability and Stewardship. We will be asking our Pupil Voice committee to begin to establish an Eco Club for the children, so please encourage them to look out for this.

## <u>Attendance</u>

Due to high levels of holidays having been taken this term, the Governors and I have made the decision that all holidays, except for those exceptional circumstances outlined in our policy, will be sent to the Local Authority for a fine from January onwards. This is not a decision that has been taken lightly, but seeing the impact these holidays have over time on the children's learning means that this is the next step to reducing these. Thank you for your support and understanding in booking holidays during school holiday time.
