
Recommended phonics focus: CH OU ON OI

- CH sound in champignon
- ON sound in oignon
- Liaison. The reason why the final letter 's' in les is sometimes
  pronounced and sometimes left silent in the unit is due to liaison in
  French. If the article/determiner is followed by a noun that starts with a
  vowel a normally silent 's' is pronounced by as a 'z' sound. As with les
  oignons, les épinards and les aubergines.
- H Aspiré. The letter 'h' in haricots is called a h aspiré. It is still a silent 'h' and not pronounced but it acts like a consonant. The final 's' in les remains SILENT when used with haricots verts.
