Recommended phonics focus: CH OU ON OI

- CH sound in flèche
- OU sound in **bijoux**
- ON sound in bronze, Anglo-Saxons, maison & ronde
- Ol sound in histoire
- Liaison. The final letter 's' of suis which would normally be <u>silent</u> is pronounced like a letter 'z' as the word suis is followed by a word beginning with a vowel (here a 'u' in un or une). This is called liaison.
- Guttural 'R'. Becoming more familiar with the French 'r' sound as seen in ronde & bronze. Made from the back of the mouth, not the front.
