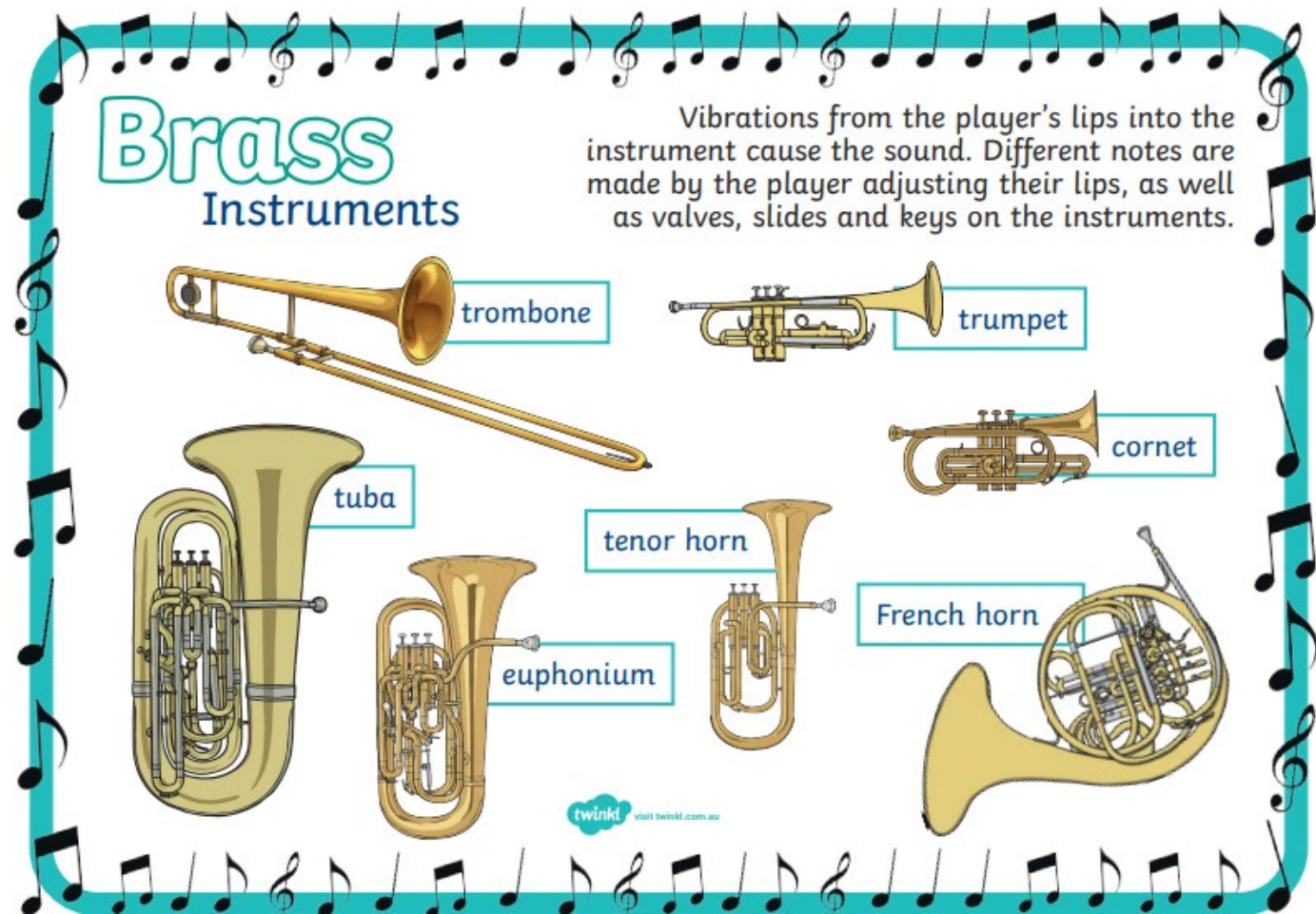

Key Vocabulary

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|---------------|----------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------|
| Vocals | The parts of the music that are sung. |
| Verse | A section of a song that often has the same melody but different words. Some songs can have several verses. |
| Beat | The steady pulse that keeps going through a piece of music and keeps you playing at a steady tempo. If the tempo changes during a piece of music, the pulse can speed up or slow down. |
| Unison | Playing or singing the same notes together at the same time. |

2. Recall memorable phrases heard in the music and recognise major and minor tonality.
3. Start to use simple structures within compositions e.g. introduction, verse, chorus or AB form.
