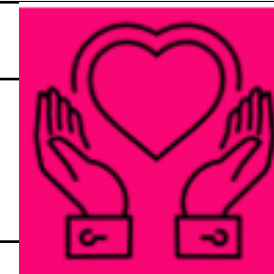




Objectives and Sticky Knowledge

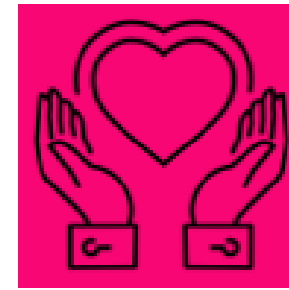

Stealing

Key Vocabulary

Consent	<i>To give permission or approval, to agree.</i>
Possession	<i>The condition of having or owning something.</i>
Permission	<i>Approval to do something.</i>
Trust	<i>Firm belief in the reliability, truth, or ability of someone or something.</i>
Borrowing	<i>When you take and use something that belongs to someone else, with their permission. After using it, you return it.</i>
Stealing	<i>When you take something from someone without permission and do not intend to return it.</i>
Responsible	<i>Having good judgement and the ability to act correctly and make decisions on your own.</i>
Irresponsible	<i>Not thinking enough or not worrying about the possible results of what you do.</i>



Key Facts

- The characteristics of a friendship include: mutual respect, truthfulness, trustworthiness, loyalty, kindness, generosity, trust, sharing interests and experiences and support with problems and difficulties
- It is important to give and seek permission in relationships with friends, peers, and adults
