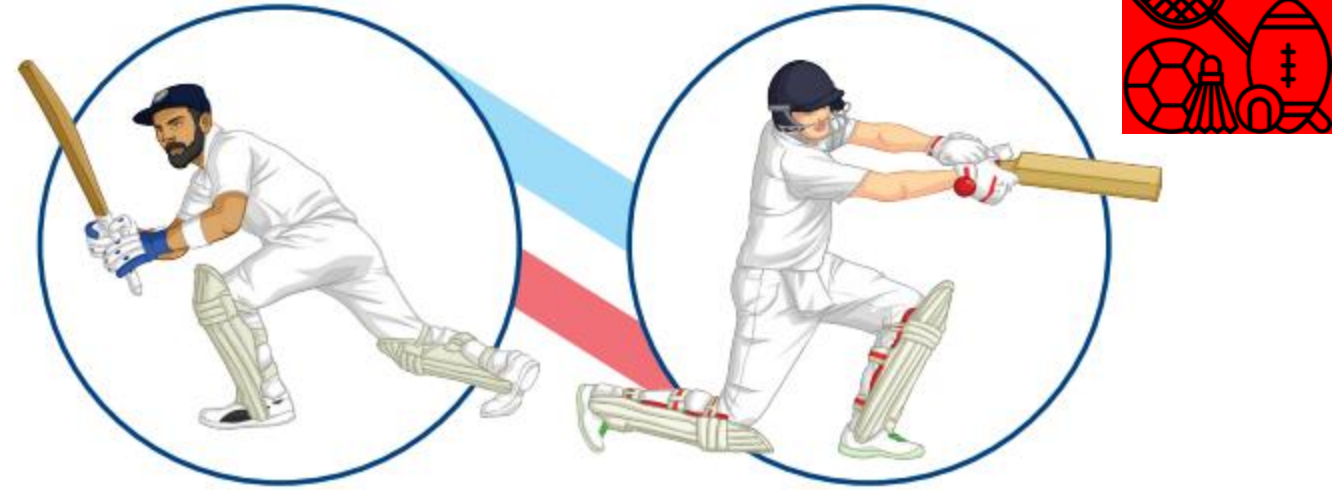

Scoring	Pitch	
<p>A run is scored when a batter hits the ball and runs the length of the wicket.</p> <p>A 'four' is scored when a struck ball reaches the boundary.</p> <p>A 'six' is scored when a struck ball passes over the boundary without touching the ground.</p>	<p>The pitch is a large area, usually made of grass, which has a strip called the wicket in the centre where the batters run along.</p> <p>At each end of the wicket are a set of stumps.</p>
