# WORD OF THE WEEK

# P R U D E N C E

**Prudence** is the virtue of sound judgement, making wise decisions based on reason and faith. It is about taking the time to think before we act, considering the consequences of our choices, and seeking guidance from God and wise counsel. **Prudence** helps us navigate life's complexities, discern God's will, and make choices that align with our values and beliefs. It is a key virtue for living a life of integrity and purpose.

#### Sunday's Gospel Luke 16:20-25

Lazarus was at the rich man's door, hoping to eat the bits of food that fell from the rich man's table.
Lazarus died and was carried by the angels to the feast in heaven. The rich man dies and was buried, in Hades, he saw Abraham, far away, with Lazarus at his side. So he called out, "Father Abraham! Take pity on me, and send Lazarus to dip his finger in some water and cool off my tongue, because I am in great pain in this fire!" But Abraham said, "you were given all the good things, while Lazarus got all the bad things. But now he is enjoying himself here, while you are in pain."



Prudence helps us build a better world and help people where they need it as we can make decisions based on God's love and mercy. Subsidiarity means that decisions should be taken by people at the lowest level, by the people who are most affected. Governments should only step in when local communities are unable to help. This means that the people who understand can have autonomy on how they help the need in their community with their people.

In this Gospel, Jesus narrates a parable contrasting a rich man's luxurious life with Lazarus, a destitute man. After death, Lazarus found comfort with Abraham, while the rich mane suffered. The rich man's plea for relief and a warning for his brothers was denied, emphasising the sufficiency of Moses and the prophets' teachings. The Gospel parable about Lazarus and the rich man illustrates that our actions have consequences beyond this life. It teaches us that how we treat others, especially those in need, influences our eternal destiny. It highlights the concern for the poor and suffering. It reminds us that our faith calls us to help those who are less fortunate. It emphasises the importance of paying attention to the Scriptures to guide our lives.



# Mission

During the GATHER, we should now see that we are in a time of prayer. We need to make the space feel different. Have some music playing. Think about the lighting and how you want them to sit. Have a prayer focus. A prayerful space for people to focus on and that contributes to the time of prayer. Explain why each item in on the prayer focus. Welcome those to the prayer through song and words.

Have a moment of prayer. Explain what your theme is.

"Welcome to our Celebration of the Word. We will begin with the Sign of the Cross ..."

- "Our theme today is ...
- "Our theme means ..."
- "We can live out our theme today by ..."
- "On our prayer focus, we have chosen ..."

#### Word

During the WORD, we hear a piece of Scripture that is linked to our theme. The Scripture is at the centre of our Celebration of the Word. Tell us why you chose it and explain how it is still relevant today. Be creative and show this by using your God given gifts.

"The Scripture we have chosen today is the story of ..."

- "We chose this Scripture because ...
- "It links to our theme because ..."
- "We can live out this Scripture today by ..."
- "We will now reflect on this Scripture story by ..."

#### Response

During the RESPONSE, we think and reflect on the message that we have heard through the Scripture. Link a thought or an action to the theme. Make sure that everybody in the room is taking part in some way. Whether that be through physical, spoken, or written responses. Have a moment of prayer. Be silent, say a prayer or sing a song. Explain why we as a group are responding to God in this way.
