

# R O S A R Y

The **rosary** is a prayer that we can all use to meditate on the life of Jesus Christ. It is a powerful tool for prayer and spiritual growth through the intercession of Mary our Mother. The **rosary** can help us to grow in our faith, to deepen our relationship with God, and to find peace and comfort in difficult times.

# **Sunday's Gospel**

Luke 17:5-6

Sing As I Kneel Before You by Maria Parkinson









In this Gospel, Jesus teaches that even the small amount of faith can achieve great things, emphasising that fulfilling obligations is simply doing what is expected of us. Jesus mentions that faith as small as a mustard seed can do great things. It shows us that the size of our faith is less important that its true presence and action in our lives. It teaches us that following Jesus means serving without expecting rewards; our actions are part of our Christian duty. Faith involves trusting in God's timing and in His plan, even when we don't understand.

During the GATHER, we should now see that we are in a time of prayer. We need to make the space feel different. Have some music playing. Think about the lighting and how you want them to sit. Have a prayer focus. A prayerful space for people to focus on and that contributes to the time of prayer. Explain why each item in on the prayer focus. Welcome those to the prayer through song and words.

Have a moment of prayer. Explain what your theme is.

### Word

### Response

During the RESPONSE, we think and reflect on the message that we have heard through the Scripture. Link a thought or an action to the theme. Make sure that everybody in the room is taking part in some way. Whether that be through physical, spoken, or written responses. Have a moment of prayer. Be silent, say a prayer or sing a song. Explain why we as a group are responding to God in this way.
