WORD OF THE WEEK N C L U S I O N

Inclusion is about welcoming everyone as a child of God, regardless of their differences. It is about creating a community where everyone feels valued and respected. We can promote **inclusion** by being open to others and but standing up against discrimination. We can also make sure that everyone has a voice and that everyone is **included** in decision making.

Sunday's Gospel Luke 17:14-19

On the way they were made clean. When one of them saw that he was healed, he came back, praising God in a loud voice. He threw himself to the ground at Jesus' feet and thanked Him. The man was a Samaritan. Jesus spoke up, "There were ten who were healed; where are the other nine? Why is this foreigner the only one who came back to give thanks to God?" And Jesus said to him, "Get up and go; your faith has made you well."



Preferential option for the poor emphasizes that we morally should address the needs of the poor and the marginalised in our society. It is about putting the people in most need first, not as an act of charity, but as a matter of justice. Not overlooking their human rights, but following the example of Jesus, who showed a particular love for the poor and sick.

In this Gospel, ten lepers asked Jesus for mercy. As they went to show themselves to the priests, they were healed. Only one, a Samaritan, returned to thank Jesus and Jesus praises his faith. This passage shows us that healing comes from God, but faith will also lead to spiritual healing. God's mercy is for all, but showing gratitude to God is important as we may face challenges in our lives, like the lepers, but suffering for Christ leads to glory with Him. But is shows us above all else that Jesus is always faithful and heals those in need, even those who do not return to thank Him.



During the GATHER, we should now see that we are in a time of prayer. We need to make the space feel different. Have some music playing. Think about the lighting and how you want them to sit. Have a prayer focus. A prayerful space for people to focus on and that contributes to the time of prayer. Explain why each item in on the prayer focus. Welcome those to the prayer through song and words.

Have a moment of prayer. Explain what your theme is.

Response

Explain why we as a group are responding to God in this way.
